## Developing a Guidebook to Veterinary Clinical Skills Laboratories

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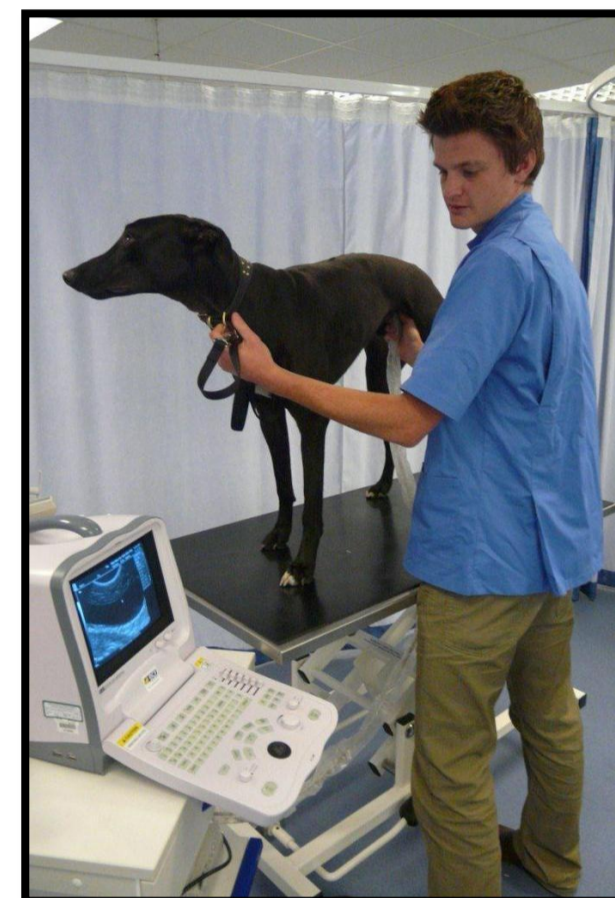
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## BACKGROUND:

## AIM:

- Provide guidance on the key factors relating to successful design, implementation, running and sustainability of a Clinical Skills Laboratory (CSL)
- Information is also relevant to anyone involved in teaching practical and clinical skills i.e. from the anatomy lab to the clinic



## CHAPTERS ON:

- Which skills should and can be taught
- Where to set up or build your CSL
- What equipment is available to develop or make the skills stations
- How to promote learning e.g. supporting resources
- Approaches to teaching and staff training
- Curriculum integration
- Assessment of clinical skills
- Management of a CSL (day to day running, financial planning, sustainability, etc.)
- Extras: peer-assisted learning, contextualised simulation, educational research in a CSL, references, useful resources and examples of learning materials
